

MEANING

Wealth, cattle

ESOTERIC MEANING

Abundance, success, new beginnings

HISTORICAL USAGE

Used in early Germanic societies to denote wealth, particularly in the form of livestock.

INTERESTING FACTS

Fehu is often associated with Freyr, the Norse god of fertility and prosperity. It is the first rune of the Elder Futhark.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Wealth is a comfort to all men; yet must every man bestow it freely, if he wish to gain honour in the sight of the Lord."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Symbolizes prosperity, financial strength, and new ventures.
Used in modern rune readings to suggest financial gain or

Aurochs (wild ox)
ESOTERIC MEANING
Strength, endurance, courage

HISTORICAL USAGE

Symbolized raw physical power and untamed potential.

The aurochs was a now-extinct species of large wild cattle.

Uruz is often linked to overcoming obstacles and personal growth

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"The aurochs is proud and has great horns; it is a very savage beast and fights with its horns; a great ranger of the moors, it is a creature of mettle."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Represents inner strength, persistence, and primal energy in rune readings.

Giant, thorn
ESOTERIC MEANING
Conflict, defense, reactive
force

HISTORICAL USAGE

Associated with the giants (Jötnar) of Norse mythology; represents powerful natural forces.

INTERESTING FACTS

Thurisaz is sometimes linked with Thor, the thunder god, due to the shared root with the word 'thorn' and his connection to protective force.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"The thorn is exceedingly sharp, an evil thing for any knight to touch, uncommonly severe on all who sit among them."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Seen as a warning or indication of a necessary confrontation; protection through strength.









MEANING God, ancestral deity ESOTERIC MEANING Communication, wisdom, divine inspiration

HISTORICAL USAGE

Associated with the god Odin, often seen as a symbol of divine authority and spiritual insight.

INTERESTING FACTS

Ansuz is strongly connected to Odin, who is known for sacrificing himself to gain wisdom and the runes.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"The mouth is the source of all language, a pillar of wisdom and comfort to wise men, a blessing and joy to every knight."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Signifies messages, clarity of thought, and intellectual or spiritual breakthroughs in divination.

ESOTERIC MEANING
Travel, life path, rhythm

HISTORICAL USAGE

Represented physical journeys such as horseback travel or spiritual journeys of growth.

INTERESTING FACTS

Raidho suggests the right way to proceed, and it can represent justice or lawful order.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Riding is said to be the worst thing for a horse; by the same token, it is much worse for him who does not know it."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Symbolizes movement, progress, and the cycles of life in modern readings.









MEANING

Torch

ESOTERIC MEANING

Enlightenment, knowledge, creativity

HISTORICAL USAGE

Associated with fire and transformation, as well as the forge and craftsmanship.

INTERESTING FACTS

Kenaz may be linked to Loki due to its associations with fire, change, and chaos leading to renewal.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"The torch is known to every living man by its pale, bright flame; it always burns where princes sit within."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Symbolizes personal illumination, clarity, and the creative spark in rune readings.









MEANING Gift ESOTERIC MEANING Generosity, exchange, partnership

HISTORICAL USAGE

Represented both literal gifts and the reciprocal bonds of obligation and honor in Norse culture.

INTERESTING FACTS

Gebo implies not only the act of giving but also the spiritual contract it creates between people or with the divine.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Generosity brings credit and honour, which support one's dignity; it furnishes help and subsistence to all broken men."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Symbolizes balance in relationships, giving and receiving, and meaningful connections.

Joy

ESOTERIC MEANING

Harmony, joy, well-being

HISTORICAL USAGE

Symbolized fellowship and shared happiness within a tribe or family.

INTERESTING FACTS

Wunjo is the culmination of the runes before it—after challenge comes clarity and happiness.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Bliss he enjoys who knows not suffering, sorrow nor anxiety, and has prosperity and happiness and a good enough house."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Suggests success, inner peace, and emotional satisfaction in rune readings.







HAH-GAH-LAHZ

MEANING

Hail

ESOTERIC MEANING

Disruption, uncontrolled forces, transformation through crisis

HISTORICAL USAGE

Associated with natural forces beyond human control, such as storms or destructive weather.

INTERESTING FACTS

Hagalaz may signal a time of chaos, but also a crucial turning point or opportunity for renewal.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Hail is the whitest of grain; it is whirled from the vault of heaven and is tossed about by gusts of wind then it melts into water."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Represents necessary upheaval, cleansing change, or karmic forces.

Need, necessity
ESOTERIC MEANING
Constraint, hardship,
resistance

HISTORICAL USAGE

Represented unavoidable need or scarcity, often indicating inner trials.

INTERESTING FACTS

Nauthiz encourages facing hardship as a source of strength and transformation.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Need is distress of the heart; yet it often becomes a source of help and salvation to the children of men."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Suggests patience, self-discipline, and learning from resistance.









MEANING

Ice

ESOTERIC MEANING

Stillness, pause, clarity through suspension

HISTORICAL USAGE

Represented frozen stillness, inactivity, or halting forces in nature

Yew tree
ESOTERIC MEANING
Endurance, protection,
initiation

HISTORICAL USAGE

Associated with the yew tree, which was sacred and symbolic of life, death, and rebirth.

INTERESTING FACTS

Yew wood was used for making bows; the tree's longevity and toxicity made it a powerful symbol.

RUNF POFM EXCERPT

"Yew is a tree with rough bark, hard and fast in the earth, supported by its roots; a guardian of flame and a joy on native land."

Birch tree

ESOTERIC MEANING

HISTORICAL USAGE

Symbol of fertility and family, especially linked to feminine energies.

The birch tree was often one of the first to grow after a forest fire, representing rebirth.


RUNE POEM EXCERPT

ING-WAHZ

MEANING
Fertility god Ing
ESOTERIC MEANING
Potential, gestation, inner growth

HISTORICAL USAGE

Linked to the god Ing (possibly another name for Freyr), associated with peace and prosperity.

INTERESTING FACTS

Ingwaz is a rune of internal development, often indicating a time before fruitful action.

RUNE POEM EXCERPT

"Ing was first seen among the East Danes, until he later went eastwards; the wagon ran after him. Thus the warriors named the hero."

MODERN INTERPRETATION

Symbolizes stored energy, completion, and familial connection.









DAGAZ DAH-GAHZ

MEANING

Day, dawn

ESOTERIC MEANING

Othala encourages reclaiming personal and cultural heritage, and protecting sacred traditions

"An estate is very dear to every man, if he can enjoy there in his house whatever is right and proper in constant prosperity."

Stands for roots, community, and long-term values.
